6:30PM **Welcome & Vote in New Members.** New members voted in are Ransom Owens and Kyle Bundy from Escalante. Five members present at the meeting. Bill Weppner as chairman conducted the meeting and Margie Weppner as secretary took notes..

Go-Utah Web Page Invoice Approval. Cydne reported the web page contract with Go Utah needed to be renewed in order to continue work on it. The Invoice is \$2199 for 1 year. She indicated there is still the interactive map to be added which should take place in the next couple of months along with the trail text and pictures to support the map. Motion to renew for another year to end of June 2005 was passed

Trail Signing Plan Update. Cydne reported on signing around the local towns. She reviewed the signing procedure to the committee. There are some issues to be ironed out, but the signing process should be ready to go by August sometime.

Dixie-Fishlake National Forest Motorized Trail Revision. Dixie and Fishlake are in the process of a Forest Plan Revision that involves redefining their trails and eliminating cross country travel. Bill Weppner would like to write a letter to the Forest Service requesting the Garfield County Trails Committee be included all of the Plan Revision meetings. Bill Weppner motioned to write a letter to Dixie-Fishlake National Forest requesting that Garfield County Trails be considered for Cooperative Agency Status in their planning process.

Summer Meeting Plans. Bill Weppner made a suggestions that no county wide meeting be held during the summer. It was decided to skip July and the next meeting will be held August 11th in Cannonville.

Trail Issues Cydne Quitter indicated there were still route problems that needed to be addressed before a proposal to add these routes to the Monument Travel Plan could be completed, such as Little Desert and the Hole in the Rock Road. It was agreed that Brian Bremner and Brian Bellew should review these specific route problems. The Garfield County Trails Committee would like to be involved in these rerouting issues.

Membership Activity. It was suggested by Bill Weppner that the Trails Committee should host another trail event which would be an ATV ride to try to boost membership. More discussion will be during the August meeting.
